CAST NOTES

KRISTEN HARRIGAN (Annie)

Kristen is making her second appearance for ACT. She previously appeared in "Carouse!" as Carrie. Kristen is a member of ACT II and also sings with the Des Moines Choral Society. She has been singing and dancing since she was 3 years old, and when she was 12, she also appeared in a production of "Annie" as the Flying Indian. She brings many talents to the theater--singing, dancing and acting.

SCOTT FAULKNER (Frank Butler)
