Kat Beane (Jane Bond) is a newcomer to the ACT stage, but has performed elsewhere in musicals, operas, comedies and children's theater. Her singing career was enhanced while she attended and graduated with a music major from Luther College. Kat works at Midland Credit Union in Urbandale and lives in West Des Moines.



Lisa DeWaard (Miss Liz Truesdale) has performed in two shows in the past year at ACT. She sang and danced in *Godspell* at the theater and at the Iowa State Fair, and played four different characters in *Phantom Tollbooth*. Her energy is endless. She is an avid karaoke fan and is known as The Hugger. Lisa works as an annuity specialist and lives in Clive.



Bob Fry (Bob Rayfield) has performed in seven shows for ACT. His debut was in the 1996 *Plaza Suite.* He has also been in numerous other shows around the Des Moines area. His reputation as a class act precedes him. Bob works in the insurance industry and lives in West Des Moines.



Susan Jacobson (Ann Martin) has a long list of theater credentials, many of them on the ACT stage. She also serves on the ACT Board of Directors. She has many hobbies including dance classes, reading and baking. She is a veterinarian and lives in Ankeny with her husband and pets.



Larry Johnson (Hal Rush) is not a newcomer to theater or ACT. He has used his singing voice in *Lil' Abner*, *The King and I*, and at the Iowa Fringe Festival to name a few. He has also performed in dramas and mysteries. Larry lives in Ankeny, loves to travel and is an eligible bachelor.



Mike Kentopp (Drew Pelman) is a familiar name around ACT and the former Ingersoll Dinner Theatre. Mike's roles for ACT include several murder mysteries when he was the "cop." No one will ever forget Mike's portrayal of Teddy Roosevelt in short pants and tooting the bugle.



Kay Mueller (Hazel LaVerne) has performed in most theaters in Central Iowa, including the murder mystery, *Towards Zero*, at ACT. Her favorite shows were *How the Other Half Loves* and *Whose Wife Is It Anyway?* Her activities include swimming and reading mysteries. Kay teaches speech and theater at DMACC in Boone. She also lives in Boone.



Karen Pederson (Sara Farnham) has become a familiar thespian at ACT. She has directed, acted, served on the Board of Directors, built sets and can fall out of a door - splat! She even sings, when necessary. She is the Library Director in Bondurant and lives in Ankeny with her husband and son.



Keith Pederson (Sheriff Wiley) has been bitten by the acting bug. *Murder Takes the Stage* is his seventh show in five years. His first appearance at ACT was in *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* and the second was *Death and Taxes*, directed by wife, Karen. Keith lives in Ankeny and works for USPS.



Bud Pratt (Ollie Dunning) is a familiar face in Ankeny and ACT. His booming voice and laughter has been a trademark for Bud. He has been known to lead the laughter in ACT comedies. Clare Stordahl (Mitzi Bond) has followed in her father's footsteps by doing her third murder mystery for ACT. She has also worked behind stage doing makeup, fixing hair and doing stage work. Clare is a hair stylist and works at a salon in Ankeny.



Jo Reid & Grace Leverenz (Director & Producer) have had a director/producer relationship for 19 ACT productions. They met in 1986 with the production of *Guys and Dolls*. Jo was directing and Grace was in the chorus. Their partnership began in 1989 with the first ACT production of *Bad Seed*. Counting *Murder Takes the Stage*, they have worked on eight musicals, eight

mysteries and three comedy/feel good shows together. While Jo and Grace have gone solo in several other ACT shows, they hope to team up again many more times in the future.



Jada and Emy Lou Kentopp (Diva Dogs) are making their first appearance at ACT. We hope we will be seeing both young starlets again on stage in the future.


