



#### **Director's Notes**

I fell in love with this script at first read. Summers and drive-ins bring back great childhood times. I remember pillows and pajamas, food, and fireworks. Going to the drive-in was a great adventure – whether with family or friends. Drive-ins may actually have been the first social network for teenagers. And those old movies, they were treasures. Now we watch them and shake our heads in amusement and disbelief. But back then – I knew for absolute certain that: shouting 'No' was not going to stop the villain, shouting 'Help' would guarantee the arrival of the hero, and the only thing slower than slow-running monsters were the people the monsters were chasing. Despite all those absolutes, I still laughed and cried and screamed in all the right places at those old movies. I like shows that make me think, touch my heart, challenge my beliefs, and teach me new ideas but sometimes I want a predictable, funny, scary, 'shake your head' kind of show. Saturday Night at the Drive-In is exactly that kind of simple entertainment. So feel free to laugh, shout and even 'shake your head' – but most of all just really enjoy yourself!
