

### A Note From The Playwright/Director

Santa decides that it's time to retire. Could he really walk away from something that he was born to do? What would the North Pole succession plan be? If he could be coaxed out of retirement at the request of a single child, who would that be and why? Those were the questions I set out to answer when I started writing this play two years ago.

At the time, I was a Director of Philanthropy at Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI). One of LSI's many programs was foster care and adoption services. I was aware of the need for supportive families to provide safe and loving homes for these children and decided that Rebecca – the child who inspires Santa to come out of retirement – would be one of those children. I spent time with my LSI colleagues to develop the character of Rebecca, as well as the foster family that takes her in.

I have many people to thank for the encouragement and influence that resulted in this show, but I will single out one person in particular – my wife, Anne. She has put up with two years of questions like, "How does this sound?" "Will this work?" "Is this funny to you?" "Is this believable?" The words of the script are mine, but none of them would be possible without her. I love you, Anne!

This play is about family and finding a place where you belong. My thanks to the Ankeny Community Theatre for giving me that sense of belonging. I dedicate this show to my family, many of whom traveled to town to make *A Gift for Rebecca* part of this year's Claes Christmas reunion.

My thanks, too, to Four Oaks -- whose mission is to recruit and retain stable, nurturing and diverse foster and adoptive families to keep children safe and assist them in their transition to permanency. Please help yourself to the literature that they have provided and contact them if you feel called to join them in their mission.
